Superintendent's Message

The 2015-16 school year was filled with Good News in Catholic Education in the Diocese of Baton Rouge! Students, parents, faculty, staff, administrators, board members, religious, and clergy worked together throughout the year to achieve the vision of *Evangelizing Hearts, Educating Minds, Encouraging Talent and Embracing the Future.*

The indication of how well schools in the diocese *Evangelize Hearts* can be seen in several ways. The Assessment of Catechesis and Religious Education (ACRE) results reflect another year of scores that are above the national norm for faith knowledge, showing that students are receiving quality instruction in the faith. Schools across the diocese reported a total of more than 200,000 hours in service to the community during the school year, which is indicative of students living their faith in service to others. Ministry to families unable to afford tuition grew again this year as more students were welcomed into Catholic schools through state sponsored funding programs. Teachers and administrators continued to earn credits in religious education as they completed basic, intermediate and advance certification, equipping them to teach through the lens of faith throughout the program of studies. Retreats were held for board members, principals and assistant principals to bring together leaders across the diocese to develop their faith as they work to strengthen the ministry of Catholic education.

Schools strive through academic programs to *Educate Minds*, and the effectiveness of their work is evident through metrics and awards. The ACT composite score for the Class of 2016 is 23.9, which is well-above both state and national averages, indicating that a quality academic education has been received by students in the diocese. Further, principals chose to adopt a more rigorous standardized test, and students in Grades 3 – 8 took the ACT Aspire test this year for the first time. Even though the test was new and challenging, results indicate that the vast majority of grade levels in all subjects were above national average. Accomplishment was celebrated as another school in the diocese received the NCLB National Blue Ribbon School Award. Joining several other schools that have received the award in recent years, St. Aloysius' honor reflects strong programs throughout the diocese as a result of continued collaboration between schools.

Several opportunities to *Encourage Talent* were evident during 2015-16, as faculty and staff members

provided co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and opportunities outside the classroom. Through these activities, students were able to further identify and develop their gifts and talents and enhance their creative, aesthetic, social/emotional, physical, and spiritual capabilities. Whether students were participating in student council or beta club activities, joining a club that interested them, playing ball on a court or field, demonstrating technological skills with robotics, playing music, or performing in a dramatic production, talent development was encouraged throughout schools in the Diocese of Baton Rouge this past year!

Children are educated to be ready for the future, and schools *Embrace the Future* each day through careful planning for growth with key stakeholders. The self-study for national accreditation as a district was completed early in the year, and ALL schools in the Diocese of Baton Rouge continue to maintain national accreditation! As part of the accreditation process, schools implement plans for continuous improvement, which result in clear focus toward student growth as well as building organizational capacity within and among schools. With the addition of Cristo Rey Baton Rouge Franciscan High School to the diocese, 2015-16 was a year full of hope for a bright future for the students and families served.

Thank you for your interest in Catholic education in the Diocese of Baton Rouge. We are blessed to have community support as well as the leadership of Bishop Robert W. Muench, who supports the educational ministry throughout the diocese, and the leadership of local priests, who nurture the ministry of education within their parishes. Always relying on the Holy Spirit, we are grateful to have had a wonderful journey this past year and look forward to continuing success in the future!
